## Year 4- Topic 6 – Self Discipline



### What should I already know?

That Lent is a time to remember Jesus' total giving.

### What will I be learning?

- **Ask and respond** to questions about their own and others' experiences of being self-disciplined.
- **Ask questions** about what they and others wonder about how people can reach their full potential.
- **Retell** some of the religious stories of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter.
- Use religious vocabulary to **describe** some religious actions and symbols of Lent and Holy Week.
- **Describe** some ways in which Christians try to be self-disciplined in Lent.
- **Make links** to show how feeling and beliefs affect their self-discipline and that of others.
- **Compare** their own and other people's ideas about questions concerning the need for self-discipline.
- **Make links** between religious stories of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter and Christian beliefs.
- Using a developing religious vocabulary, **give reasons** for religious actions and symbols connected to Lent and Holy Week.
- **Give reasons** why Christians try to be self-disciplined in Lent.

### Big Question

How can I be self-disciplined in the choices I make?

How will self-discipline help me to grow and to reach my full potential?

### Key Words

<b>Communion</b>	The part of the mass where bread and wine are consecrated & shared as a meal.
<b>Community</b>	A group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common.
<b>Giving</b>	Providing love or other emotional support.
<b>Receiving</b>	To take into your possession.
<b>Liturgy of the word</b>	The second part of the mass during which the faithful are instructed in the revealed word of God.
<b>Penitential Act</b>	The invitation by the priest at Mass for the congregation to acknowledge their sinfulness.
<b>Lamb of God</b>	One of the names given to Jesus Christ.
<b>Concluding rite</b>	The end of the mass where blessings are given and the congregation are asked to go out and spread the word of God.
<b>Sign of peace</b>	The part of the mass where members of the congregation share a sign of peace, usually a handshake.
<b>Introductory rite</b>	The beginning part of the mass where a community is formed to worship God.
<b>Eucharist</b>	The Catholic sacrament commemorating the Last Supper in which bread and wine are consecrated and shared.
<b>Communion rite</b>	The celebration of the Eucharist as a meal, made up of 6 parts.
