Thank you to parents who have returned the most up to date contact details, this is vital in case of an emergency at school. If you have not yet returned the forms please do so immediately. If you need help or guidance with completing the forms please contact the school office, as we are always happy to help. We need to have a minimum of three contacts for each child.

Attendance 2022 - 2023

Having the best attendance at school is vitally important, as this leads to improved learning for your child (knowing more, remembering more and doing more).

If your child's attendance has dropped below 90% you will shortly be receiving a letter from school.

As you are aware, holidays during term time **cannot be authorised**. The table below shows the impact that time out has on learning. Please note, the Local Authority may issue a Penalty notice to each parent of each child who is withdrawn from school during term time.

100% Attendance	0 weeks of missed learning	Best chance of success. Fantastic!
95% Attendance	1 week, 4 days of missed learning	Chance of success. Well Done!
90% Attendance	3 weeks, 4 days of missed learning	Persistent Absentee. Worrying- At risk of legal action from the Local Authority.
85% Attendance	5 weeks, 3 days of missed learning	Poor Attendance. Very worrying.
80% Attendance	7 weeks, 3 days of missed learning	Very Poor Attendance Very concerning.

If you feel there is an exceptional circumstance where your child needs to have a leave of absence from school, then please complete the 'Exceptional Circumstances form' and return to school at least 14 days in advance of any request for absence. The form can be obtained from the school office and from the school website under parent information—attendance/absence. An appointment with a member of the Senior Leadership Team will be arranged to discuss your request.

Please see below details of attendance recorded in school from the start of the autumn term. Pupil attendance at school has been mandatory since September and the usual rules on attendance apply, including:

- Parents duty to ensure that all children attend at all times
- Schools responsibilities to record attendance and follow up absence

• The ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, in line with local authorities codes of conduct.

Please remember to contact school before 9:30 a.m. if your child will be absent from school.

Jan Gurkin, our family support/attendance worker continues to monitor pupil attendance and will contact families to discuss any concerns.

Parking and Travel Tracker

Parents are reminded that the turning circle is for a quick drop off only, children get out of the car and walk into school watched by their parent or carer before driving off. If you walk your child into school, you must park away from school. The Engine Public House are happy for parents to use their car park.

Living Streets' WOW – the walk to school challenge is back to help encourage as many children as possible to experience the benefits of walking to school. As you know, WOW is a pupil-led behaviour-change initiative where children self-report how they get to school every day. If they travel actively (walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or Park and Stride) at least three times a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge.

Remember, you can Park and Stride to help your child earn their WOW badge. Park or hop off public transport at least five minutes away from the school and walk the rest of the way.

There are 11 new WOW badges to be earned, one for every month of the school year. Each badge has been designed by a pupil from across the UK as part of our annual WOW Badge Design Competition. Pupils will be taking part in a Walk Through Time, earning badges while learning about key historic moments ranging from prehistoric creatures, to ancient societies, to important moments and great journeys that changed the world. The badges are made in Cornwall from recycled plastic material that was otherwise destined for landfill, including fridge trays, plastic plates and yoghurt pot off-cuts.

Health and Safety
