## What should I already know?

- **Recognise** that people are kind and loving because God made them.
- Ask and respond to questions about their own and others' experiences about new beginnings.
- Ask questions about what they and others wonder about the reasons for some beginnings being easy and others difficult and realise that some questions are difficult to answer.
- **Retell** the story of Creation as a religious story or some phrases from the psalms.
- **Describe** and use some religious words and phrases about types of prayer.
- **Describe** that people are kind and loving because God made them.
- Ask questions about what they wonder about the beauty around them and God creating the world.
