### What should I already know?

### Key Words

<b>Birthday</b>	A celebration to remember the day a person was born.
<b>Waiting</b>	An action of staying where you are or delaying an action until something happens.
<b>Wreath</b>	A circle of green leaves.
<b>Celebrate</b>	A gathering or activity to mark a special event.
<b>Christmas</b>	The celebration of when Jesus was born.
<b>Advent</b>	A season in the Church's year where we are waiting the arrival of Jesus.
<b>Jesus</b>	God's son.
<b>Mary</b>	Jesus' Mummy, chosen by God.
<b>Joseph</b>	Mary's husband
<b>Swaddling clothes</b>	A type of blanket or clothing that would be wrapped around a baby.
<b>Manger</b>	A long container, usually made of wood where horses or cattle (cows) would feed. Jesus was laid in a manger when he was born in a stable.
<b>Crib</b>	A traditional bed for a baby.
<b>Shepherds</b>	People whose job it is to look after flocks of sheep.
<b>Wise men</b>	Men who were very wise and studied the stars to help to tell them about special events.
