## Year 3- Topic 5 – Listening and Sharing



### What should I already know?

The Eucharist: the parish family thanks God for Jesus.

### What will I be learning?

- **Ask and respond** to questions about their own and others' experiences and feelings about listening well and sharing.
- **Ask questions** about what they and others wonder about the joys and difficulties of listening and sharing and realise that some of these questions are difficult to answer.
- Use religious words and phrases to **describe** the actions and symbols used during the celebration of the Eucharist.
- **Describe** some ways in which Christians share God's love with others.
- **Make links** to show how feelings and beliefs affect their own and others' desire to listen and to share.
- **Compare** their own and others' ideas about the questions of how and why we listen and share and that these questions are difficult to answer.
- Use a developing religious vocabulary to **give reasons** for specific actions and words used during the celebration of the Eucharist.
- Give **reasons** why Christians want to share the Good News of Jesus.

<b>Eucharist</b>	A celebration consisting of 2 parts. The liturgy of the Word & the liturgy of the Eucharist.
<b>Liturgy of the Word</b>	Where Christians listen to God's Word in the readings, listen to the homily and the prayers of the Faithful.
<b>Liturgy of the Eucharist</b>	Here the gifts are prepared, the Eucharistic prayer expresses thanksgiving and Communion is shared.
<b>Holy Communion</b>	'togetherness.' The taking of bread & wine.
<b>Good News</b>	Jesus loves us and died and rose for us
<b>Ambo</b>	A stationary podium used for readings and homilies
